

Procedures

Parents, carers and visitors are allowed onto the school site by permission of the school. This may be withdrawn if necessary.

In the very rare instances of unacceptable behaviour the person involved will be asked to leave the school premises and/or grounds. In the case of a telephone call when requests for a calm conversation fail, the call may be terminated.

In extreme circumstances the school will call the Police.

The school will always seek to resolve the situation. However, parents should understand that resolving a problem is not always immediate and sometimes can take time. Very occasionally it is not possible to resolve issues to everyone's complete satisfaction.

Our code of conduct for parents has been developed in line with the WMBC policy for Managing Parental Challenging Behaviour on School Premises.

Introduction

Code of Conduct

We expect parents, carers and visitors to show respect and consideration for others, including school staff by:

- Setting a good example in their own speech and behaviour towards all members of the school community whilst on school premises and within school grounds.



Unacceptable behaviour

- Shouting either in person or over the telephone (loss of temper)
- Swearing
- Physical intimidation by standing too close
- Use of aggressive hand gestures
- Making threats
- Physical assault (hitting, slapping, punching, kicking)
